Teaching methods include: lectures, demonstrations, practical work, videos, role playing, games, and timed drills.

Each student receives a set of books, State Laws, and course handouts. Instructors record the grade the students earn in each exercise, lesson drill, and subject exam. Students also take comprehensive exams at various intervals during their training. The following is our grading system: A (100-93) Excellent; B (92-85) Very Good; C (84-77) Good; D (76-70) Poor; F (69-0) Failure. In addition to their workbook exercises, students are also graded on such other factors as attendance, appearance, and attitude. Instructors discuss the student's progress with them periodically.
